LATEST NEWS FROM A NATIONAL AND REGIONAL LEVEL

Jo and Julia (our Strategic Development Coordinators) have been selected to be part of a team conducting a Peer Review of Hertfordshire CC SEND services. With the OFSTED/CQC SEND Reinspection of our local area expected in the coming months, this opportunity will give our two experienced co-ordinators a valuable insight into how evaluations of SEND services are conducted by outside agencies.

What happens? - A Peer Challenge is not a "Mocksted" it is different in its intention and

execution, but it is an opportunity for key strategic stakeholders in the local area to reflect on the progress they have made in establishing the SEND reforms and most importantly to improve outcomes for children and young people with SEND. The local area (Hertfordshire) identifies lines of enquiry for the peer challenge team to investigate, based upon the outstanding issues of concern highlighted through monitoring visits with DfE SEND Regional Adviser and NHSE SEND area lead (following their OFSTED/CQC SEND Inspection).

Who's on the team?

- Parent & Carer forum representative(s) in this case, Jo and Julia!
- A local authority education officer
- A local authority social care officer
- A Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) officer and/or health provider representative (usually in role of Designated Clinical Officer DCO)
- A young reviewer from a regional pool who are experts by experience and trained by the Council for Disabled Children (CDC).
