
SPOTLIGHT ON SUPPORT GROUPS - MyOTAS

FAMILY IMPACT SURVEY 2022 -REPORT NOW PUBLISHED!

The report of our Family Impact Survey findings has now been finalised and published. The results from this report formed part of the evidence we submitted to the



OFSTED/CQC inspection portal and has been circulated to the members of the SEND Partnership Board.

What difference will it make?

Our 2020 Family Impact Survey gave us the baseline information of parent/carer experience in Essex. The results from this survey will be used to measure how and where there has been improvements and also to identify where there still improvements needed in support and information for families. There are many things that are currently being developed specifically as a result of parental feedback. SHARING SEND LIFE EXPERIENCES WITH NURSING STUDENTS

Alongside the direct work and meetings Essex Family Forum attends to share the feedback of SEND families, the Forum also looks at other opportunities to share the SEND parent/carer voice for future generations of SEND professionals. For over a year now, Tori has been working with Anglia Ruskin University (ARU) to promote the work of Essex Family Forum and share the experiences of SEND families, to year one and year two nursing students.

By sharing a very personal and candid insight in to her life as a SEND parent to two children with very differing SEND needs, Tori's presentation takes attendees on a journey. Starting with a snap-shot of a 'normal', 'perfect' family and contrasting this with the reality of SEND family life. Whilst the subject matter is emotionally heavy, Tori also keeps the presentation light-hearted, sharing the triumphs and quirky family moments that enrich the complex picture of SEND family life.

Using her professional background in Human Resources, Tori summerises the presentation by sharing techniques and development skills that can be used to help round the soft skills ('bedside manner') of professionals so that they can better support SEND families in their care. Most importantly, finally Tori then pulls on her philosophical qualifications to explain the importance of the subjectivity of experience; i.e., this is one SEND family experience - an insight, other families will bring different experiences. The focus is upon ensuring that the professional is always actively listening and is aware of the natural human trap of 'making assumptions', so they retain an open-mind with each patient they come across.

At the end students and tutors are encouraged to ask any questions of her as a SEND parent. The focus is upon a 'safe' and open discussion, where unable to answer a question or it is possibly something that some SEND families may find insensitive, Tori then uses this to give the cohort an insight in to how that may be perceived by someone within the SEND community and makes suggestions of how these things can be framed more inclusively and empathetically. *If you would like to find out more please email tori@essexfamilyforum.org*



LATEST NEWS FROM A NATIONAL AND REGIONAL LEVEL

The NNPCF have recently launched their parent carer survey on the SEND and Alternative Provision Green Paper consultation. The responses of the survey will help to inform the NNPCF's own response to the SEND Green Paper consultation. Co-chairs Tina Emery and Mrunal Sisodia stated that, "The Green Paper is an opportunity

to reset the SEND system after the 2014 reforms failed to deliver the improvements that families of children with SEND so desperately need. It is vital that every parent carer's voice is heard and so we have launched a short, simple survey to gather parental views that we will use to inform our response to the Green Paper.
