Week ending- 9/5/25

Essex Family Forum receives many comments through our online Graffiti Wall, at events and through our Family Champions. Although we are not able to address all of these through this snapshot, please be assured that all feedback is raised with services and issues that are shared repeatedly are being highlighted.

You said:	We did:
Referrals - Children's Learning Disability Service We have had queries about referrals to the Children's Learning Disability Service. We are hearing there are a lot of Autistic children requiring health assessment BUT they are not accepting referrals for at least 6 months.	We have made enquiries about timescales and will update you when we have more information. See link below how to make a referral. Children's Learning Disability Service - Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust
Lack of Support - Year 7 We are hearing from many parents of children in Year 7 especially, undiagnosed but on a pathway, who are not receiving any support or understanding in school. Initial reasonable adjustments seem to be made for the first term of Year 7 but don't continue from then on. Children receiving detentions and constantly getting into trouble for minor things.	There are some pilot projects running which are designed to tackle these issues. We have asked for an update on these. We will provide an update as soon as we get a response.
Education Access We're hearing that the Education Access Team is requesting Annex forms, but many families don't have access to a professional to complete them, and GPs are refusing to sign. As a result, some children are being left without access to education.	We have contacted the Education Access Team to discuss how families struggling to access a professional for Annex forms can be better supported. Transition Support without an EHCP

There are concerns about the limited support available for young people without an EHCP, particularly when transitioning to further education. In some cases, young people are left unsure of how to progress in their chosen careers due to a lack of available support and guidance.

Families have expressed frustration over the refusal of GCSE re-marks, particularly when students miss the required grade by a narrow margin.

Some students are required to enrol in courses that don't align with their interests or career goals simply to access GCSE resits, with few alternatives like dedicated re-sit classes at adult education centres.

Families have reported difficulties in securing apprenticeships, with some worried about exploitation during trial periods, as their young person is vulnerable.

We met with the Preparing for Adulthood Team (PFA) and discussed the importance of ensuring services remain accessible to young people without EHCPs, Social Care Plans, or diagnoses, recognising the need for these schemes. It was noted that requiring such information could place additional pressure on health, social care, and local authorities, which must also be considered. The next meeting we have with PFA is in June, where further discussions will take place on these and other related issues.

Update - Dental Services

As shared previously we continue to receive feedback regarding the difficulties SEND families have with accessing appropriate dental appointments and treatment for children and young people with SEND. This has been raised as an issue across Essex and has been particularly highlighted as an issue families within BAME groups are feeding back.

We have raised this at the SEND Quadrant meetings and will continue to feed this back. We have also recently fed this back to the dentistry team in the Suffolk and North East Essex ICB and asked for further information regarding support available.

In other news.....

- Claire attended the Healthier Habits Hub in Halstead she talked to families and linked in with other services such as Healthwatch Essex, Citizen's Advice Bureau, Community Agents and the Mid Essex Recovery College.
- Claire went to a Home Start session in Chelmsford this week and spoke to families of
 pre-school age children just starting on their SEND journey. She was able to signpost
 them to relevant services and gave them copies of Supporting your Neurodivergent
 Child.
- Stacey attended the SEND meeting for WEST quadrant. Members are getting ready for
 the Ofsted inspection that will be happening soon. Some work is being done around the
 Correlation between SEND and Mental Health, with focus on neurodiverse children. To
