- Ruth had the pleasure of meeting Jamey and Carly from POP Essex, both dedicated Family Champions who provide an outstanding service in Braintree. I'm really looking forward to returning in the New Year to take part in one of their parent sessions. Thank you for making me feel so warmly welcomed.
- Ruth visited Kinetix Academy CIC this week and had the pleasure of meeting their passionate team. We explored the impressive timetable of activities they already provide, and I'm excited to be joining them next year to connect with families.
- Stacey attended the SET Therapies West Essex Oversight delivery group meeting this
 week. The group will be working on getting clear communication to families about
 the link therapists, and whole balance system. Therapy advice lines are now

- Claire and Kate attended the Joint Commissioning Group on Monday, which is attended by representatives from Education, Health and Social Care in Essex. We heard updates regarding Autism in Schools project, Children's Learning Disability Service, Therapies and Local Government reforms. We also heard updates from the Integrated Care Boards covering Essex.



- Claire attended the Children's and Young People Transforming Care Steering Group on Tuesday. She heard updates about the number of children in Tier 4 beds in Essex and the SET CAMHS Eating Disorder service.
- On Wednesday, Claire attended the Council for Disabled Children National Event: Inclusion and Beyond. Clare Burton, Director for SEND at the Department for Education spoke about the upcoming White Paper and Claire was one of the attendees invited to speak to Clare Claire talked about the struggle families have with their children and school attendance primary and secondary school Claire explained that families don't feel listened to in the early stages and if their child masks at school it's even harder to be heard. The Attendance requirements on schools add to the pressure. We also heard from NHS England on their current projects and attended workshops on specific areas.
- Claire attended the SET Learning Disability Annual Health Check Forum on Wednesday and highlighted the difficulties of getting a child on a GP's Learning Disability Register, as GPs have different criteria for adding a child to the register.
- Carly attended a meeting with the MSE BCYP Growing Well Programme Board. The
 meeting discussed various initiatives and challenges related to children and young
 people's mental health and neurodiversity. Key points included the need for a
 flexible, needs-led mental health model, the impact of long waiting times for autism
 and ADHD assessments, and the importance of inclusive services. The
 neurodivergent pack, developed by the Southend City Youth Council, was
 highlighted as a significant achievement, aiming to destigmatize neurodivergence
 and provide practical support, created by young people, for young people we hope
 to be able to share this with you soon.
- Sarah attended the North East Essex Neurodevelopment Adult Partnership (NAP)
 Meeting this week. Whilst this meeting is aimed at adult services/support, Essex
 Family Forum cover 0 to 25 years of age so it is important and useful to have a
 presence at this meeting and share feedback from families especially relating to the
 transition into adult services.
- Sarah attended a parent/carer roadshow at Holland Par School this week. The event was held during the schools learning review day.
